2025 Budget Meetings

Brockton Council are holding Special Council Meetings to discuss the 2025 Municipal Budget on Monday, January 13, 2025 at 10:00 a.m., Tuesday, January 24, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. and Tuesday, February 11, 2025 at 1:00 p.m. in-person at the Bruce County Council Chambers and electronically on Zoom/livestreamed on eSCRIBE.

2025 Fees and Charges

Animal Control – Dog Tags

The Municipality of Brockton is mailing dog tag invoices in January 2025. Invoices are based on dog owner information in our current database, and your dog will continue to wear the permanent tag you received previously. If you no longer own a dog, need a replacement tag or to register a new dog, please contact the By-Law Department by phone at 519-881-2223 Ext. 141, or email the Animal Control/By-Law Enforcement Officer.

- First Dog \$20.75
- Additional Dog(s) \$20.75
- Late Fee (after April 1st) \$10.50/per tag
- Dangerous Dog(s) \$206.25/per dog
- Replacement Dog Tag \$5.25
- Kennel Licence New or Renewal (Includes first inspection fee) *More than 3 dogs and must meet Kennel Licence requirements - \$154.65
- Kennel Licence Non-Compliance re-inspection of Kennel \$51.55/per inspection
- Kennel Licence Late Payment Charge (after April 1st) \$61.85
- Reclaim Fee \$105.00 Municipal Fee (not including Pound fees incurred)

Kennels: If you are registering a new kennel or renewing a kennel license, a Kennel Application and inspection is required. Please contact the Building/By-Law Department at 519-881-2223 Ext. 141 or email the Animal Control/By-Law **Enforcement Officer** to obtain a Kennel License Application.

Public Comments on Possible Commemoration

This spring will mark the 25th anniversary of the Walkerton e.coli outbreak, which occurred in May 2000. As we approach this date, we recognize the anniversary will bring mixed emotions for many residents. For some, this anniversary may offer a chance to reflect and remember, while others may prefer to look ahead, leaving the past behind. Residents who were impacted might find comfort in coming together with the community to honour memories and share their experiences.

In light of this, Brockton Council is seeking input from residents about a possible commemoration to take place in May 2025 at the Heritage Water Garden in Walkerton. The commemoration could provide an opportunity for the community to reflect on the past, acknowledge the progress made, and recognize ongoing efforts to ensure that Ontarians have access to safe, clean drinking water.

We invite residents to share any thoughts, ideas or concerns regarding a possible commemoration by Friday, March 7, 2025. Your feedback is invaluable in helping us determine the most meaningful and appropriate way to recognize this anniversary. We welcome all feedback, including if our community feels a commemoration is not appropriate.

Fence Viewer Expression of Interest

The Municipality of Brockton is seeking five (5) individuals to serve as a Fence Viewer for the Municipality of Brockton, responsible for resolving disputes under the Line Fences Act. Individuals will be appointed as a Fence Viewer for approximately two years (2025 to 2026).

If the services of Fence Viewers are required, Fence Viewers will review the landowner's application requesting a fence viewing, survey the property with the landowners, and make a decision regarding the fence, as per their responsibilities under the Line Fences Act. Fence Viewers will receive compensation for their services. Visit our Line Fences Act webpage for additional information on the role of the Fence Viewer and the Municipality's Fence Viewing By-Law.

If you are interested in serving as Fence Viewer for the Municipality, please submit a letter of interest to the Clerk's Department by **email**, or by mail or in-person to the Municipal Office located at 100 Scott Street, PO Box 68, Walkerton, ON NOG 2VO. Applications will be accepted until February 19, 2025 at Noon.

Development Charges Update

In 2024, the Municipality of Brockton, with support from B.M. Ross & Associates, began a comprehensive Development Charges Background Study which examined Brockton's growth projections, the infrastructure required to support it, and the capital costs involved, while exploring how Development Charges (DCs) can help fund these needs. Feedback from the public, stakeholders, and the development community was collected and presented to Council.

At the December 10, 2024, Council Meeting, Brockton Council approved proceeding with Development Charges, granting both the first and second readings to the Development Charges By-Law. The decision marks an important step in the development process for the community. The Development Charges By-Law was posted for further public comment.

Final consideration of the By-Law will occur at the January 14, 2025 Council Meeting. Once the By-Law is passed, Development Charges will be in effect with various exemptions related to affordable and attainable housing operations, and East Ridge Business Park developments.

From November 1 to March 31, the Brant Landfill (57 Concession 8, Elmwood) is open on Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Greenock Transfer Station (564 Concession 10, Chepstow) is open on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Walkerton/Hanover Landfill (868 Bruce Road 4, Walkerton) is open on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. The Walkerton Recycling Depot (320 Kincardine Highway) is open on Thursday from 9:00 to 11:00 a.m. All residents are encouraged to continue to use curbside pickup services. Winter Home Emergency Kit

Winter is back and Bruce County has already experienced some significant snow and winter weather events. We all know that we should have an Emergency Preparedness Kit at home to ensure that you and your family can remain safe for several days in the event of an emergency. You should refresh that kit a couple of times a year and for the winter months we should ensure that we have items that will keep our families comfortable and warm. Heavy snow and and/or freezing rain can often cause downed power lines resulting in power failures. Make sure that your kit has the items you need to sustain your household in the event of a power outage.

Here are some recommendations for winter home emergency kit:

- Having a backup generator is ideal to help with lights and heat for your home during an outage.
- If having a generator is not an option, consider the use of candles but make sure they are in a safe location to avoid a fire hazard. Identify a room that can be kept contained to retain as much heat at possible.
- Warm blankets or thermal blankets, wool socks and extra mitts and hats should also be available in your kit even in your home.
- At least one flashlight with batteries will assist once it gets dark.
- Non-perishable food and water are also key items all year round.

Extra consideration should be given for your home emergency kit during the winter months. Power outages can have more implications for your family with cold weather. Make sure your kit has the appropriate supplies to help keep your family safe and warm in the event of a power failure during a winter storm.
