# 2022 Municipal and School Board Election Results

The Municipality of Brockton thanks all eligible electors for exercising their right to vote in the 2022 Municipal Election. Results from the Election are available to view on our website Brockton.ca/Election. There was a voter turnout of 35.4% with 2,839 (35.4%) of 8,012 electors voted in the 2022 Municipal Election. 28 electors declined their ballot and are included in the turnout. From November 1 to March 31, the Brant Landfill is open on Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Greenock Landfill is open on Fridays from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. The Walkerton/Hanover Landfill is open on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. All residents are encouraged to continue to use curbside pickup services. Residents are reminded to wear a face covering and maintain physical distancing when attending the Landfills. A limit of 10 vehicles at a time remains in effect for the Brant and Greenock Landfills. #### Winter Parking Restrictions

In accordance with Section 8 of the Municipality of Brockton's Consolidated Traffic and Parking By-Law 2020-052, no person shall park on any highway between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. inclusive during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April.

#### 2023 Fees and Charges

## South Bruce O.P.P. Detachment – Senior Safety Week

Senior Safety Week is November 6 – 12, 2022. This year the South Bruce OPP wants to raise awareness on elder abuse. Elder Abuse is violence, mistreatment, or neglect that older adults may experience at the hands of a spouse, child, other family member, caregiver, service provider or someone in a position of power or trust. The most common form of elder abuse in Canada is Financial. Financial abuse is the theft or exploitation of money, property, or assets. If you think you are a victim of financial abuse talk to someone you trust, get legal advice, and talk to your bank for advice on how to protect yourself. You can reach additional community resources by calling 2-1-1. If you or someone you know is a victim of Financial Abuse you should make a report to police.
