Winter Fire Hydrant Access Reminder

Help our firefighters by clearing snow around fire hydrants to allow easier access in an emergency. Remove any ice and snow, clear a three-foot perimeter around the hydrant, and clear a path from the hydrant to the street. By-Law 2019-118 also requires individuals to keep hydrants clear from obstructions, such that shrubs, trees, and hedges should be trimmed to allow free access to the hydrants.

Holiday Landfill Hours



South Bruce O.P.P. Detachment - Holiday Cons

This is a hectic time of year. Getting togethers with friends, family, neighbors, co-workers. Theft is a crime of opportunity. When we have so much going on, there is a higher chance we will become a victim of property crime. The South Bruce OPP is offering you some tips to help you avoid you protect your property from con artists and thieves this holiday season.

Cons and Scams

- If it sounds too good to be true, it likely is.
- Remember that you can't win a contest that you didn't enter in the first place.
- If you have a concern about your computer, take it to a reputable repair shop for service. Do not provide remote access to
- a "tech" that calls you out of the blue
- Gift cards are a red flag. If someone contacts you and directs you to buy gift cards, you need to hang up the phone.
- Your best defence is to verify any unsolicited contact. Unsolicited means that you didn't ask for it.

Pocket Your Keys

Vehicle owners and operators should always follow the Auto Theft Protection Tips of the Lock it or Lose it program. This becomes especially important during the holidays which are hectic enough without becoming a victim of theft. These tips not only help to prevent auto theft, they also help to prevent the theft of valuable objects that may be left in your vehicle:

- Always roll up the windows, lock the door and Pocket your Keys.
- If you have a garage, use it. Lock the door as well as the vehicle.
- Always park in a well-lit area.
- Never leave your vehicle running while it's unattended.
- Never leave valuable objects in plain view.
- Never leave your car keys in plain view.

Items that are typically reported stolen from a vehicle include: GPS units, laptops, tools, lap top computers, loose change and gifts that are left in plain sight.

Porch Pirates

If you prefer to shop online and have packages delivered to your door, the South Bruce OPP is offering these tips to ensure you receive your package:

- Request a signature on delivery
- Ship the package to a trusted neighbor who will be home
- Have the package delivered to your workplace
- Track your delivery online. Know when it arrives and arrange to be there or have someone pick it up on your behalf for safekeeping
- Install video cameras and post signage to advise the video surveillance is in place

Winter holidays are a time for families and friends to get together. But that also means a greater risk for fire. Following a few simple tips will ensure a happy and fire-safe holiday season.

HOLIDAY DECORATING

- Be careful with holiday decorations. Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Some lights are only for indoor or outdoor use, but not both.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections. Read manufacturer's instructions for number of light strands to connect.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- Keep decorations away from windows and doors.



HOLIDAY ENTERTAINING

- Test your smoke alarms and tell guests about your home fire escape plan.
- Keep children and pets away from lit candles.
- Keep matches and lighters up high in a locked cabinet.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- Ask smokers to smoke outside. Remind smokers to keep their smoking materials with them so young children do not touch them.
- Provide large, deep ashtrays for smokers. Wet cigarette butts with water before discarding.

Before Heading Out or to Bed

Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed. **Turn off** all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.

FACTS

- (1) More than **one-third** of home decoration fires are started by candles.
- More than two of every five decoration fires happen because decorations are placed too close to a heat source.
