Credit Card Payment

The Municipality of Brockton offers credit card payments for all accounts receivable, utility and tax accounts. You may pay an invoice or tax bill through https://secure1.paymentus.com/rotp/broc. Select the payment type and enter your account number as shown on your invoice or tax bill. Please enter your Postal Code under Zip Code, exactly as it is shown on your invoice. You have the option to pay several accounts at once. Follow the prompts to enter your account information as well as your payment information. Please be advised that an additional fee will be charged to use this service, which will be calculated for you prior to completing your payment. Tax Installment Due Dates - September 30, 2024 and November 29, 2024

Any payment received in our office after the due date will be considered late and any outstanding taxes will be subject to penalty and interest charges as per the Municipal Act. 
Address Changes

Please notify the tax department if you have any changes to your mailing address. This must be done in writing or by emailing taxes@brockton.ca. Your cooperation in keeping your tax records up to date ensures timely receipt of your tax and utility bills from our office.

2024 Municipal Budget

The 2024 budget contains \$20.5 million in operating expenditures and \$5.8 million in capital expenditures. After revenues and reserve fund transfers are applied, the Municipality must levy \$12,531038; a 6.41% tax rate increase over 2023. This levy increase will assist the Municipality in maintaining current levels of service while planning for the future, including the increasing demands on our roads infrastructure.

Through the direction of Council, tax dollars are put into action to serve residents and help our community prosper. Have you ever wondered how each tax dollar is spent? The image below shows the 2024 budget broken down into different functions. As you will see, there is a lot more to the budget than just roads and bridges.



Property Assessment

In 2016, the Municipal Property Assessment Corporation (MPAC) updated the assessed values of every property in Ontario. All properties have a legislated valuation date of January 1, 2016. These values were used by the Municipality of Brockton to calculate your property taxes from 2017-2024. In 2020 MPAC was due to reassess property values; however due to the COVID-19 pandemic MPAC has postponed property tax assessments until 2025. Changing Your School Support

Property owners in Ontario are required to support a school board, even if they do not have children or their children are not currently attending school. In the case of a residential property occupied by tenants, the tenants can direct the school support for that property. By default, school support is directed to your municipality's English Public School Board. MPAC is legislatively required to collect school support information and provide it in the assessment roll to every municipality and school board. By ensuring that you are supporting the school board of your choosing, you will be able to vote in the next municipal and school board election for trustees in that school board. Property owners, occupants, and tenants can update their school support designation online at mpac.ca/schoolsupport.
