Livestock Evaluator Expression of Interest

The Municipality of Brockton is seeking individuals to serve as a Livestock Evaluator for the Municipality of Brockton, responsible under the **Ontario Wildlife Damage Compensation Program** to conduct a thorough investigation within 72 hours of being notified or livestock, poultry, and/or honey bees that have been damaged or killed by wildlife. The Evaluator/investigator must ensure all relevant evidence is documented through detailed colour photos and a complete application

form. Livestock Evaluators are required on an infrequent basis throughout the year, and the Evaluator will receive compensation for their services. Individuals will be appointed as a Livestock Evaluator for approximately two years (2025 to 2026). Proposal to Add Additional Accessible Parking Space on Jane Street, Walkerton

The Accessibility Advisory Committee and Municipality are seeking the public's feedback on a proposal to amend the Traffic and Parking By-Law to add another accessible parking space along Jane Street, Walkerton, beside Sacred Heart

Parish to accommodate persons with disabilities. There are currently two (2) existing accessible parking spaces on Jane Street beside Sacred Heart Parish.

Traffic and Parking By-Law - No Parking Restrictions

Council approved By-Law 2025-025 amending the Traffic and Parking By-Law restricting parking on Yonge Street South, Walkerton. There is no parking permitted on both sides of Yonge Street in Walkerton. Visit our By-Laws page to view all Traffic and Parking By-Law amendments, including a list of all streets with parking restrictions. Remember to check for signage before parking to avoid penalties.

Tax Installment Due Date -May 30, 2025

Any payment received in our office after the due date will be considered late and any outstanding taxes will be subject to penalty and interest charges as per the *Municipal Act, 2001*. Notice of Walkerton Watermain Flushing

As part of the ongoing maintenance of the Walkerton Water System, Veolia Water will be flushing the Walkerton distribution system throughout April, May and June 2025. Residents are asked to run a cold water tap after the flushing has been completed in your area to discharge any discoloured water before use. We apologize for any inconvenience that this may cause. Load Restriction

During the Spring thaw (typically from March 1 to April 30) the Municipality enforces a reduced load season to protect roads from damage caused by heavy vehicles. Some Municipal Roads may become too soft and unstable to withstand the weight of a fully loaded truck, regardless of the axles. In an effort to reduce damage to the roads, the Municipality restricts vehicles to half loads (5 tonnes per axle) on all roads within the Municipality.

Spring Landfill Hours

From April 1st to October 31st, the Brant Landfill is open on Tuesdays and Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Greenock Transfer Station is open on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Walkerton/Hanover Landfill is open on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. All residents are encouraged to continue to use curbside pickup services. Winter Parking Restrictions

In accordance with Section 8 of the Municipality of Brockton's Consolidated Traffic and Parking By-Law 2020-052, no person shall park on any highway between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. inclusive during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April.

Yard Impact from Winter Maintenance

Is your sod ripped up from the snowplow? We know! Our drivers feel bad about it and will fix it up with topsoil and grass seed just as soon as the weather is nice enough. Please keep in mind that it will take some time to work through town, so please be patient until our staff get to yours.

Dog Etiquette and Leashing Reminder

Our By-Law Enforcement Department reminds residents about poop and scoop etiquette, and leashing dogs.

A friendly reminder that dog owners and walkers are responsible for picking up after their pet. Please carry a bag when walking your dog off your property. Owners who fail to remove dog excrement can be fined \$150.00.

When dogs are not leashed and off their property they are considered Running at Large. No owner shall permit their dog to Run at Large within the Municipality of Brockton. Allowing your dog to Run at Large may result in a fine of \$100.00.

Brockton Dollars

Brockton Dollars gift certificates are redeemable at participating stores, restaurants, and other commercial establishments in denominations of \$10, \$25 and \$50. They can be purchased from the Municipal Office at 100 Scott Street from Monday to Friday, between 8:30 a.m. and 4:30 p.m., or ordered in bulk through email. Fire Prevention Spring Cleaning Tips

While you're completing your Spring cleaning, keep in mind these tips of how you can prevent fires in your home:

- 1) Clean dust and grime around appliances Build up can be a potential fire hazard. Remember to clean your fridge's condenser coils.
- 2) Clean around your dryer and stovetop Clear the area of things that can burn, such as cleaning supplies, clothing, or boxes.
- 3) Clean your dryer vents Lint can build up in vents and create blockages.
- 4) Check electrical cord placement Make sure cords are not running across doorways or under carpets, which can overheat.
- 5) Replace damaged cords
- 6) Properly store combustibles Keep combustibles like gas and aerosol in a cool, dry place, out of reach for children and pets.
- 7) Clear excessive clutter Large quantities of items can be a potential fire hazard, especially if they block your home's exit points like doors or windows.
- 8) Clear dead vegetation Rake or remove flammable vegetation such as leaves, dead limbs, and twigs around or under structures.
- 9) Gently clean smoke alarms Help reduce false alarms created by dust! Follow your manufacturer's recommendations for routine cleanings.

Spring into Preparedness: Refresh Your Emergency Kit This Season

With spring just around the corner, many households are getting ready for their annual spring cleaning. This year, why not use the opportunity to review and update your home's Emergency Preparedness Kit?

"We always encourage our Bruce County residents to ensure their families are prepared for emergencies. Creating and maintaining an Emergency Preparedness Kit is a simple but effective way to gain peace of mind, knowing you can remain self-sufficient for a few days if needed," says Ray Lux, County Emergency Management Coordinator. "Being prepared allows emergency services to focus on the areas and individuals who need them most."

Every household should have an easily accessible Emergency Preparedness Kit in case you are required to shelter in place during an emergency. A well-stocked kit takes some planning and should be reviewed at least once a year to ensure it's ready when you need it most. Here are a few helpful tips to guide your spring refresh:

- Replenish your water supply to meet your family's drinking needs for at least three days.
- Check expiry dates on non-perishable food items and replace as needed.
- Inspect battery-powered items, such as radios and flashlights, and ensure you have fresh batteries on hand.
- Review your Family Emergency Plan and update emergency contact information if anything has changed.
- Print hard copies of important documents, such as insurance policies, wills, and medication prescriptions.
