## Possible Camera Installation at Walkerton Community Centre/Arena to Broadcast Hockey Games

The Provincial Junior Hockey League (PJHL) is potentially considering installing cameras inside the Walkerton Community Centre to be installed in the rafters of the arena to display footage of Walkerton Capitals Jr. C Hockey Team games. The camera would be focused on players on the ice, however there is a possibility that spectators would be recorded and appear on the broadcast through PJHLTV.ca. # **Load Restriction**

During the Spring thaw (typically from March 1 to April 30) the Municipality enforces a reduced load season to protect roads from damage caused by heavy vehicles. Some Municipal Roads may become too soft and unstable to withstand the weight of a fully loaded truck, regardless of the axles. In an effort to reduce damage to the roads, the Municipality restricts vehicles to half loads (5 tonnes per axle) on all roads within the Municipality.

# Sanitary Sewer Reminder

Residents connected to the Municipal Sanitary Sewer System in Walkerton, please be cautious of the items you put down your sink or toilet. Do not put down the drain or flush any of the following items: food chunks, grease, cooking oil, hazardous chemicals, metal, glass, cloths, rags, napkins, any feminine hygiene products, paper towels, wipes, hair clippings or clumps, sand, or cat litter. Flushing these products can result in costly sewer backups and higher sewer treatment and maintenance costs.

#### Winter Landfill Hours

From November 1 to March 31, the Brant Landfill is open on Wednesdays from 9:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Greenock Landfill is open on Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. The Walkerton/Hanover Landfill is open on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Fridays, and Saturdays from 8:00 a.m. to 3:00 p.m. All residents are encouraged to continue to use curbside pickup services. #### **Winter Parking Restrictions**

In accordance with Section 8 of the Municipality of Brockton's Consolidated Traffic and Parking By-Law 2020-052, no person shall park on any highway between the hours of 2:00 a.m. and 6:00 a.m. inclusive during the months of November, December, January, February, March and April. Any vehicles in violation may be ticketed and towed at owner's expense. A reminder that it is illegal to deposit snow on sidewalks or roads.

# South Bruce O.P.P. Detachment - - Project Safe Trade

Online classified and auction sites are often used as tools to sell stolen property to unknowing victims and can present a safety threat. In order to increase public safety and reduce crime, the Ontario Provincial Police invites members of the public to use their OPP detachment parking lot to facilitate property transactions arranged online.

The South Bruce O.P.P. have launched a Project Safe Trade "Community Safe Zone" at the Walkerton Detachment (25 Bruce Road 19, Walkerton) and invite the community to use these two (2) reserved parking spots for online transactions.

#### South Bruce O.P.P. Detachment - March is Fraud Prevention Month

Every year, the South Bruce OPP takes part in this national initiative to help raise awareness about cons and scams that are taking so much money, and to help promote fraud prevention.

Fraud is any false, deceptive, or misleading act. Attempts are made daily by telephone, email, text message, social media, fax and going door to door.

DO NOT respond or otherwise engage these con artists. It's difficult for investigators to track down the scammers and even harder to get your money back.

#### The Numbers:

The Canadian Anti-Fraud Centre reported that Canadian victims lost \$554 million dollars to fraud in 2023

In the first two months of 2024, residents of Southern Bruce County have reported losses of over \$103,000 dollars to fraud.

Between December 11, 2023, and December 29, 2023, the South Bruce OPP received 5 reports of Fraud with losses totaling nearly \$500,000:

- Online purchases made through a fraudulent website \$97 USD
- Two incidents of E-transfer made to help a "grandchild" \$3,000 each time
- Crypto exchange through a fraudulent site \$140,000 USD
- Crypto investing through a fraudulent online broker \$338,00
- These are significant amounts of money, BUT we estimate approximately 5-10% of scams are reported. So, these reported amounts could be 5-10% of the actual dollar losses

#### Points to Remember:

- Tech-savvy scammers use technology to create very convincing schemes designed to trick you into sending them
  money.
- Con artists will typically use the name of an established company or government agency, to gain your trust, so that you will send money or personal information to them.
- · Your best defence is to verify any unsolicited contact. Unsolicited means that you didn't ask for it.
- Don't respond to phone numbers or web link addresses provided by a con artist. Look up contact information for the actual business, or branch of the government, to verify who you're dealing with
- Fraud is a multi-billion-dollar international enterprise that will only end when the scammers stop making money.
- We can beat the cons and scams working together; the OPP asks you to Recognize, Reject, Report Fraud.

March is Fraud Prevention Month, but the cons and scams are attempted every day.
