# Committee Recruitment: Business Viability Committee – Durham Street Bridge

The Municipality of Brockton is currently recruiting for Committee members on the Business Viability Committee – Durham Street Bridge to serve as a resident of Brockton, a business community representative, and an industrial business representative. The Business Viability Committee -Durham Street Bridge will facilitate the creation and implementation of a Business Viability Action Plan in an effort to



offset economic challenges for Brockton businesses, industry and residents during the bridge construction period. The Business Viability Action Plan will be developed and implemented with input from businesses, industry and resident representatives, with support and regular communication inputs from the County of Bruce. The Committee will foster community support and investigate funding opportunities to support Walkerton's business community as the bridge is rehabilitated. ### South Bruce O.P.P. Detachment – Back to School Safety

Children across the South Bruce Ontario Provincial Police (OPP) detachment area have returned to school. Some will be walking, some will be riding bikes and many others will be riding on school buses to get to and from school. The return of school buses and student pedestrians means the roads will be busier. Give yourself extra time to get where you're going and help keep out students safe. The South Bruce OPP is asking all drivers to be extra careful and observant for children on or near roadways, particularly near school zones. Keep your speed down and watch for students that try to cross the road in an unexpected location.

#### **Crossing Guards:**

Did you know that it's against the law to ignore a school crossing guard? According to Section 176 of the Highway Traffic Act (HTA), your vehicle must be stopped until the crosswalk is clear.

• Where a school crossing guard displays a school crossing stop sign as provided in subsection (2), the driver of any vehicle or street car approaching the school crossing guard shall stop before reaching the crossing and shall remain stopped until all persons, including the school crossing guard, have cleared the roadway and it is safe to proceed.

Motorists that fail to stop for a school crossing guard stop sign face a fine of \$365 and 4 demerit points upon conviction.

#### **School buses:**

The South Bruce OPP is reminding drivers to watch for school buses stopped on the roadway with alternating red lights flashing. Under Section 175 of the Highway Traffic Act (HTA), drivers meeting a stopped school bus and drivers approaching a stopped school bus must stop:

- Every driver or street car operator, when meeting on a highway, other than a highway with a median strip, a stopped school bus that has its overhead red signal-lights flashing, shall stop before reaching the bus and not proceed until the bus moves or the overhead lights have stopped flashing.
- When approaching a school bus from the rear that has its overhead signal-lights flashing shall stop at least 20
  meters before reaching the bus and not proceed until the bus moves or the overhead lights have stopped
  flashing.

Motorists that fail to stop for a stopped school bus face stiff penalties upon conviction. First offence, the maximum fine is \$2,000 and 6 demerit points. For each subsequent offence, the maximum fine is \$4,000, or imprisonment, or both, and 6 demerit points.

If the driver can't be identified, the registered owner of the vehicle observed in violation of the law may be charged with failing to stop for a stopped school bus.

The South Bruce OPP encourages all parents and caregivers to take some time this weekend to talk to their children on the importance of being safe when travelling to and from school.
